RULES WILL PREVAIL.

ALL BEDDING MUST BE PROVIDED BY EXHIBITOR. THIS MAY BE BROUGHT FROM HOME OR PURCHASED AT FAIR FROM THE OFFICIAL STATE VENDOR. NO BULK SAWDUST, TAN BARK OR SHAVINGS PERMITTED. ONLY BALED OR BAGGED BEDDING ALLOWED.

ENTRY DEADLINE: JULY 10

All entries and awards in this department will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations published in this premium list and also to the following rules:

1. Entries in this department must be entered through our online entry system, giving the name, registration number, and date of birth of the animals to be exhibited. An entry fee of \$15 per head will be charged for all entries submitted by midnight on July 10. To enter online, go to www.kystatefair.org.

LATE ENTRIES: An entry fee of \$30 per head will be charged for all entries submitted after July 10. Late entries must be submitted by midnight on July 25.

EXTRA LATE ENTRIES: Entry Fees of \$50 per head will be charged. Extra late entries must be submitted by midnight on August 3.

2. Substitutions will be allowed in the same class only and must have the same ownership as the original entry. Substitutions should be made at check-in.
3. All goats must be registered in the ABGA herd book by the date specified by the show. All goats entered into ABGA sanctioned shows must be registered with the ABGA in order to acquire Ennoblement points.
4. Original registration certificates are required, except that a copy of a

- registration application, stamped with the date received by one of the listed associations, can be accepted for kids less than 3 months of age. Animals over the age of 3 months must have the original registration certificate in hand at time of show.
5. The documents specified above as the requirements for that age animal to be shown must be presented to the Show Secretary for verification before the judging begins.
 6. All goats must have legible tattoos consistent with the registration certificate or the animal will be disqualified. If an animal is disqualified due to illegible or inconsistent tattoos, all lower placing animals will be moved up in placement. Point winners from each class must have their tattoos read and recorded. The judge will be responsible for ensuring that tattoos are read and properly recorded. The show secretary will be responsible for recording the tattoos and informing the judge as to which point-eligible goats will need to be checked. An exhibitor that is showing an animal with a microchip as permanent identification is required to provide a microchip reader for verification of animal identity.
 7. Birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate, will be used in determining class divisions. In order to calculate the class breaks, take the show date and count back to the birth date to determine the age and the class for the animal.
 8. Classes: All animals must be registered Purebred, Fullblood or percentage blood Boer goats. Percentage doe classes are for goats 50% to 88% Boer; Fullblood classes are for does that are 93.75% and higher and bucks that are 96.87% and higher. Progeny of fresh does will not be allowed in the ring with their dam. The Champion and the Reserve Champion classes will be chosen from the first and second place animals in that division of the show.
 9. At the discretion of the judge and the superintendent, the animals may be let loose in the ring as a function of judging.
 10. No animal bracing allowed at ABGA Sanctioned Shows. Goats' front legs must be on the ground during the judging. Front feet must remain on the arena floor during Judge's evaluation. Exhibitors may lift feet off the ground for a period not to exceed 10 seconds when posing the goat.
 11. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to refrain from presenting any animal owned by the presiding judge within 90 days prior to the show date.
 12. Exhibitors bringing entries into the Kentucky Exposition Center on or after August 19 must pay admission or present exhibitor's ticket. Exhibitor tickets may be purchased while making entries through our online entry system.
 13. All livestock should be brought through Gate 4 on Crittenden Drive.

14. All exhibitors are limited to winning two premiums and two ribbons in each class.
15. Animals entered will be received beginning on August 20 from 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. Must be checked by 12:00 Noon, August 21st.
16. No guarantee can be made as to the safety of the exhibits but every precaution will be taken to safeguard the animals.
17. Only goats entered in the show will be permitted in the barn.
18. See General Rules for information on Health Regulations and Protest.
19. **KY law prohibits tents with roofs. Tents or sleeping areas without tops are permitted if made of fire retardant material per requirement of the state fire code Section 13.3.2.6.1 and State Fire Marshall.**
20. **New for 2021: Cooking is prohibited in the livestock building at the Kentucky Exposition Center. Per State Fire Marshal recommendation referencing NFPA 150 Chapter 9.12.1.4 "Portable cooking equipment shall be used only in spaces designed for use and separated from the animal housing facility."**
